

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## Background and Rationale

The global knowledge landscape is evolving rapidly, driven by significant scientific and technological advancements. In response, children must develop multidisciplinary skills to navigate the challenges of an increasingly complex global society. However, the current education system faces significant challenges in effectively addressing the needs of this dynamic environment.

To bridge the gap between the current state of learning outcomes and the demands of the future, substantial reforms are required to ensure the highest standards of quality, equity, and integrity within the educational system—from early childhood care and education to higher education. The lack of collaboration and international forums among countries significantly hinders the implementation of these necessary reforms.

The STREAM education approach, designed to equip children with 21st-century skills and prepare them for a rapidly changing world, has not been effectively implemented in many classrooms. Curricula, teaching methodologies, and assessment and evaluation systems in schools have not been upgraded at the pace required to align with STREAM principles and evolving global demands.

Moreover, there is an urgent need to enhance teacher empowerment and capacity-building mechanisms for educators and educational leaders to better meet the needs of a rapidly evolving society. The lack of motivation among educators for research and innovation limits the development of new strategies and solutions to address existing challenges and improve the quality of education.

Additionally, there is a dearth of international platforms where educators can share best practices, research findings, and innovative ideas aimed at improving the quality of education. The valuable contributions of educators and the excellence demonstrated by schools are not adequately recognized or evaluated on global platforms.

**School owners and senior managers, school principals, teachers, staff officers, pre-primary principals, teachers and staff officers, in-service advisors, educators, curriculum developers, lecturers, teacher trainers and advisers, academic leaders, educational administrators, and policymakers are eligible to apply under Category 02.**

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## Inclusions in the Registration Fee

The total sightseeing tour covers approximately 800 km and includes visits to the provinces, districts, and cities of Colombo, Kandy, Nuwara Eliya, Badulla, Bandarawela, Monaragala, Mattala, Hambantota, Matara, Galle, and Colombo.

The individual transport cost of USD 100 is included in the registration fee.

## Exclusions

### ● Accommodation

Accommodation expenses are not included in the registration fee. Air-conditioned double-occupancy rooms are available starting from USD 20 per day in Colombo and USD 10 per day at the conference venue premises.

### ● Airport Pickup

Airport pickup services are not included in the registration fee. Transport by a four-seater car from the airport to a hotel in Colombo typically costs USD 25–30.



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## ● **Airport Drop-off**

All delegates will be dropped off at the airport at 12:00 a.m. (midnight) on January 6th, 2025.

You may schedule your departure date and time accordingly.

If anyone needs to stay a few additional days, they may be dropped off at a hotel near the airport and stay there as they prefer.

Transport by a four-seater car from the venue to a nearby hotel typically costs less than USD 4.

## ● **Breakfast Arrangements**

Breakfast is not covered by the registration fee. Normally breakfast is included for room charges in hotels.

## ● **Dinner Arrangements**

Dinner is not covered by the registration fee. However, a variety of reasonably priced dining options are available at the hotel and in nearby restaurants.

## ● **Entrance Tickets for Sightseeing**

Some historical sites may charge entrance fees, which are not included in the registration fee.

## **Optional: Full Coverage of Excluded Expenses**

If you would like the IAFQE to arrange all exclusion-related expenses, an additional USD 150 will be charged on top of the registration fee.




